Difficult times ahead for Herefordshire's Carers

Recently, the Editorial Team at Our News Our Views spotted a Herefordshire Council news report about cuts to services that support unpaid carers – people who look after family members without being paid for it.

We contacted Herefordshire Carers Support who will be affected and they sent us some comments and would like people to have their say on these cuts...

The Council are making major cuts to services for Carers for the 2017/2018 year that begins on 1st April 2017. They put this on their website on Thursday 18 January with no warning.

The Council intends to cut Herefordshire Carers Support (HCS) funding by half for the coming year with further cuts in future years.

The Council say they are expecting Carers to replace this support with **self-help, self-management and volunteering**.



"We did not expect such a huge cut and we thought we would know what would happen a lot sooner than this". "This level of cut will mean redundancies among our talented, dedicated and loyal staff which we bitterly regret. **More importantly, this new situation will have the most impact on the unpaid Carers across Herefordshire**".

"To help us urgently to make the best case for proper funding for Carer support, please contact us or make your views known by other routes. If you want any information to help you to do this, we are still here so do please get in touch."

Hereford – The name “Hereford” is said to come from the Anglo-Saxon “here”, an army or formation of soldiers, and the “ford”, a place for crossing the river.

Leominster – The town takes its name from a minster, which is a community of priests in the district of “lene” or “Leon”, probably from an Old Welsh word “lei” to flow.

Stretton Sugwas – The “Stretton” in the name comes from the Roman road which passes east-west through the village, Sugwas comes from Sugwas Pool.

Signing is a very useful skill for people who are:



- Deaf.

- Or find spoken words difficult to understand.









Inclusive Football Sessions for Herefordshire Youngsters – By Nick Baker.

Inclusive Football sessions are for young people who enjoy football regardless of their skill levels or their additional needs. These sessions provide opportunities for structured football training for boys and girls of secondary school age on a weekly basis with qualified coaches.

At the moment, a core of a dozen or so young people, of varying disabilities, meet in their Hereford Lad's Club kit every Wednesday evening during term time to practice their skills, run through exercises and drills and enjoy each other's company. However, Lad's Club are now working with ECHO to open up the session for players aged 18 – 25, so the team need more players!

The sessions run every Wednesday in term time from 6.00pm – 7.00pm at The Point 4, Hereford.

One Inclusive Football player said, "I like the football sessions because I like scoring goals and having fun with my friends. I think my football is getting better and I really like being part of a team and our kit is great! I hope some more players will come and join the team."
