- Put in over 800 hours work each in the team

Team member Tracy Roberts said, “Our News Our Views has helped me improve my computer skills and my confidence and challenged me to learn new skills. I’d never done anything like this before but now I am involved in the whole process of making the newsletter”.

Support Worker Mary Simpson added, “I love working for this team. They have developed their skills enormously over three years as creators, editors, reporters, fundraisers, bosses and supportive workmates. They have bags of enthusiasm and motivation and heaps of great ideas”.



Learning Disability Partnership Board Meeting Summary report.

Date: 21 March 2017

Overview

Here is a summary of the things we talked about at the meeting of the Learning Disability Partnership Board on the 21st of March.

WISH

We heard about plans to improve WISH over the next few months. The improvements will:

1. Allow people to find local activities
2. Add a news section to the WISH website
3. Allow people to search for personal assistants through WISH.
4. Allow people to add events or activities they run to the WISH website.
5. Make search results better.

Safer Crossing - By Lisa Perkins

I was concerned that I did not have enough time to cross the road the other day so I looked at this site:

"I found their campaign interesting and thought you would too: Everybody should be able to cross the road safely, directly and without delay. Crossings should be positioned in the right place and give everyone enough time to cross the road.

We want more (clearance) time to the cross the road timings on signalised crossings should be adjusted to reflect how quickly or slowly people walk.

The green man lighting up is your invitation to cross the road. When the green man starts flashing, that's the clearance time currently.

The time the green man spends flashing assumes that people walk 1.2 metres per second.

This was calculated in the 1950s and hasn't changed since.

However, a 2012 study showed that 76 of men and 85 of women over 65 walk more slowly.

The team found that the average walking speed was 0.9 m/s for men and 0.8m/s for women.

We know that young children also take longer to cross the road.

The History of the Master's House – Adrian Phipps

The Master's House Ledbury is a composite building. At its heart is the original timber-framed tudor mansion. Over more than 500 years this building has been adapted and added to in four main phases. It was originally a home for the master of st Katherine's hospital. Successive occupants have altered the Master's house to suit their own needs. The restoration carried out between 2011 and 2015 has revealed the story of the Master's House as never before.

Festival Fun – by Tracy Roberts


I interviewed Lofty and Rich from the band about Last Tree Squad performing at ECHOFEST later this summer.

What are you looking forward to most about ECHOFEST?




